Life Education Incursion

On the 23 June, the year 5/6 class went into the Life Education Van to learn about how kids can stay healthy and safe. We learnt about the dangerous effects drugs, alcohol and smoking can have on people not only under the age of 18 but also older. We also got to meet Harold the Giraffe who comes to see us every time the Life Education Van comes to Orange Grove Primary School. I enjoyed the time we spent in the Life Education Van because I learnt interesting facts about how to stay safe.



Year 6

On 22 and 23 June all classes went to the Life Education Van to learn about staying healthy and safe. The Year 5/6 learnt about the danger of drugs. Drugs can be good or bad. Some drugs can make you violent and change the way your body works. Some drugs like cigarettes and alcohol aren't illegal because they only affect you for a little while, and other drugs such as caffeine can be found hidden in coffee and chocolate and lots of different things. Medicine is a drug but is good for you. No matter what drug, most change the way your body works only for a little while but some change how your body works for a long time. We learnt about what drugs are legal and which drugs are illegal by getting a drug name and placing it in either legal or illegal. We also learnt that peer pressure caused a lot of people to smoke, take drugs and have alcohol before the legal age. Peer pressure is when you are influenced to do something because you want to be cool like someone or someone you like tells you to do something you should not.
