2. Aim for short screen time sessions
3. Get your child moving, especially outside
4. Imagine and create
5. Encourage play and friendship with others

## DANGER TO DOGS LEFT IN CARS

The school would like to remind parents about the danger of leaving dogs in cars. On a 29°C day the temperature inside a car can reach 44°C in just 10 minutes and a lethal 60°C in just 20 minutes. These sort of temperature increases are seen even if the windows are cracked open or if the day is overcast. Dogs can't cool themselves down as efficiently as humans do and will succumb to heatstroke quickly. They are covered in fur and can only lose heat through the pads of their feet and sweating. So please leave your dogs at home when you come to collect your kids.
