Water Corporation Upgrades



Work is being completed to upgrade the water network at the end of Boyle Lane, just outside of Orange Grove Primary School. There are planned traffic impacts to Boyle Lane commencing from Thursday 25 March 2021.

The entrance to 'kiss and drive' will be diverted to allow for work to progress safely. You will still be able to drop your children off and the 'kiss and drive' roundabout will remain accessible. Traffic management will be in place to direct you each morning and afternoon between Thursday 25 March 2021 and Thursday 1 April 2021.

We are aiming to complete the majority of work during the school holidays, however should there be any traffic interruptions in the first few weeks of term 2, traffic management will be in place to assist drivers. For safety reasons fencing will be installed around our work sites.
