Chaplain Chat: Getting Back into Rhythm

Rhythm has a huge impact on our lives, it's all around us and can affect our behaviour and interactions with others. I have recently been thinking of my weekly routine as a rhythm and how it changes from day to day. How easy is it to change from school holiday rhythm to school rhythm?

If you think of yourself as a rhythm what would it sound like? Is it steady, predictable and reliable or is it a bit more random and chaotic? Maybe it is a bit of both. When life's rhythm gets a bit all over the place we can start to feel unsafe and unsure. It can even cause conflict when our rhythm clashes with someone else's.

Think of a group of five people playing a steady beat on a drum. It is easy to follow because it is reliable and safe, the message is clear. What would happen if everyone started playing something else? The message and stability would get lost and become harder to follow. It would also make it hard for anyone new to join in because they can't clearly focus on steady beat.

We can think of our recent term break as everyone going and spending some time playing their own unique beat, doing different things and taking some time off from the routine that was Term 3. We need to think about how we can all come back together again for Term 4 and start to find that steady, stable beat that includes others and makes the approaching end to the school year run strong and smooth for students, parents and teaching staff. Everyone will find this beat at a different pace after having a two week break, some may find it faster than others and that is fine as long as we are being patient and tolerant of others.
